# PLAINTIFF PEGASUS WIRELESS INNOVATION LLC'S DISCLOSURES PURSUANT TO LOCAL PATENT RULES 3-1 AND 3-2

Pursuant to Local Patent Rules 3-1 and 3-2, Plaintiff Pegasus Wireless Innovation LLC ("Pegasus") provides its disclosure of asserted claims and preliminary infringement contentions and accompanying document production to Defendants Verizon Communications Inc., Cellco Partnership d/b/a Verizon Wireless, Verizon Business Network Services LLC, Verizon Corporate Services Group Inc., and TracFone Wireless, Inc. (collectively, "Verizon"), AT&T Inc., AT&T Corp., AT&T Services, Inc., AT&T Mobility LLC, AT&T Mobility II LLC, New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC and Cricket Wireless LLC (collectively, "AT&T"), and T-Mobile US, Inc., T-Mobile USA, Inc., Sprint LLC, Sprint Solutions LLC, and Sprint Spectrum LLC (collectively, "T-Mobile") ("Verizon," "AT&T," and "T-Mobile," may be collectively referred to as "Defendants"). Pegasus's disclosures are based on publicly available materials regarding the accused infringing products of Defendants that describe or discuss aspects of operation of these products. Fact discovery and claim construction proceedings have not yet commenced. Pegasus has not had access to any discovery of Defendants' materials at this point, and certain information is not yet available to Pegasus that may be relevant to its infringement claims. Pegasus reserves the right to supplement or alter its disclosures based on the discovery it obtains, invalidity and prior art contentions, claim construction, allowance and issuance of substitute claims by the USPTO and/or any additional information provided by Defendants.
