**ORDER NO. 33: GRANTING JOINT MOTION TO RESET THE  
EVIDENTIARY HEARING DATE AND REVISE THE  
SCHEDULING ORDER [MOTION DOCKET NO. 1413-018]**

(March 26, 2025)

On March 17, 2025, Complainants Skyworks Solutions, Inc., Skyworks Solutions Canada, Inc., and Skyworks Global Pte Ltd. (collectively, “Complainants” or “Skyworks”), Respondents Kangxi Communication Technologies (Shanghai) Co., Ltd. and Grand Chip Labs, Inc. (collectively, “KCT”), D-Link Corporation and D-Link Systems Inc. (collectively, “D-Link”), and Ruijie Networks Co. Ltd (“Ruijie”) (collectively, “Respondents” and, with Complainants, “the Private Parties”) filed a joint motion (“Motion”) to reset the Evidentiary Hearing (“Hearing”) date and revise the Scheduling Order. (Motion Docket No. 1413-018.). Commission Investigative Staff (“Staff,” and, with the Private Parties, “the Parties”) does not oppose the Motion. (Mot. at 2.).

The Hearing in this Investigation was originally scheduled for May 28-30 and June 2-3, 2025. (Order No. 10, Attachment A.). However, on November 1, 2024, Skyworks sought leave to amend the Complaint and Notice of Investigation to assert dependent claims 2, 3, 8, and 9 of U.S. Patent No. 9,450,579 (“the ’579 patent”). (Motion Docket No. 1413-006.). On December 23, 2024, Skyworks was granted leave to amend the Complaint and Notice of Investigation to

assert dependent claims 2, 3, 8, and 9 of the '579 patent. (Order No. 17 at 10 (Dec. 23, 2024).)<sup>1</sup>. However, because fact discovery was scheduled to end on January 22, 2025, the Parties were ordered to, by January 7, 2025, submit a joint proposed modification to the Procedural Schedule to reflect an extension of no more than four (4) weeks. (*Id.*).

The Parties submitted a joint proposed modifications to the Procedural Schedule with the Hearing scheduled to commence on June 25 and conclude on July 1, 2025. (EDIS Doc. ID No. 840652 (Jan. 8, 2025)). Then, on January 13, 2025, the Parties submitted another joint proposed modification requesting the Hearing commence on June 23 and conclude on June 30, 2025. (EDIS Doc. ID No. 840984.). The Parties' justification for the second submission was a scheduling conflict with one of Respondents' expert witnesses. (*Id.*). Also, a sixth Hearing Day was requested to accommodate witnesses who may testify in Chinese and therefore require translation. (*Id.*). However, there is a preference for the ALJ to avoid having five consecutive Hearing days. As a result, the Procedural Schedule was modified to, among other changes, set the Hearing to run from June 25 through June 27, 2025, and from July 9 through July 11, 2025. (Order No. 20 at 2.).

On February 11, 2025, Skyworks filed an unopposed motion to partially terminate the investigation as to the '579 patent, which removed the new claims from this Investigation that were the original impetus for extending the procedural schedule and the Hearing dates. (Motion Docket No. 1413-013.). That unopposed motion was granted. (Order No. 25 (Feb. 13, 2025)). Over a month later, the Private Parties filed the Motion seeking to schedule the Hearing to commence on July 9, 2025, and to conclude on July 16, 2025. (Mot. at 1-2.).



<sup>1</sup> Because the original version of Order No. 17 issued only as an order, rather than as an Initial Determination, a corrected version of Order No. 17 was issued on December 31, 2024, as an Initial Determination. (Order No. 17 (Dec. 31, 2024)).

The Private Parties state that they agree that consolidating the Hearing into consecutive days would “avoid the prejudice and added financial burden resulting from the current trial format that bifurcates the Evidentiary Hearing into two periods separated by 13 days.” (*Id.* at 2.). Therefore, the Private Parties argue that there is good cause to grant the Motion. (*Id.*).

For good cause shown, and because there is no opposition, the Motion, (Motion Docket No. 1413-018), is **GRANTED**. The Procedural Schedule in effect in this Investigation, (Order No. 20), is hereby modified to reflect the following Hearing dates: July 9, July 10, July 11, July 14, July 15, and July 16, 2025. No other modifications have been made, or are authorized to be made, to the Procedural Schedule.
