Thanks for getting back to me. Happy new year to you too.

As you know, MPEG LA's Licenses do not cover upstream OEM suppliers or component suppliers of non-end products. Therefore, similar to the other Licenses it signed with MPEG LA, Dell will need to conclude our DisplayPort License in order to be covered under all of the essential patents included in the agreement. If a bilateral agreement exists for a Licensor's patents, MPEG LA has a process which reconciles the double-payment made for those Licensor's patents covered under our agreement.

To that end, I look forward hearing from you again and to continuing our discussion toward Dell's conclusion of the DisplayPort License.

Thanks for your email and happy new year. As you likely remember, Dell and MPEGLA did not move forward on this starting back in 2015 because, as we understand it, our primary component supplier is already licensed to a large portion of the relevant portfolio. Under such circumstances, it's difficult for us to navigate given that MPEG-LA's licensors would, in effect, be seeking further payment on already licensed components. No real updates to that status on my side. If there are any changes in the MPEG-LA pool or if you have any updates on your side, please do let us know. Perhaps the more productive and efficient approach would be for MPEG-LA licensors to continue to reach out to the component suppliers to sort out any concerns.
