

Sic Bo (Big Small) is an ancient Chinese game played with three dice. The object of the game is for each player to pick individual numbers or combinations of numbers they think will appear after the three dice are shaken.

To play Sic Ba, you place your chips on the table layout directly on the numbers and/or combination of numbers you desire. Each player is responsible for the positioning of their chips. After the dealer calls: "No More Bets" they will shake the dice that are sealed in a shaker, uncover the dice and enter the results into the electronic layout. All winning combinations will be illuminated. Easy as 1, 2, 3.
