Subject: IPR2025-01247 - Petitioner's Request for Permission to Withdraw Petition (U.S. Patent No. 8,368,201)

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Dear Board,

In the above-referenced matter, Petitioner seeks permission from the Board to withdraw its Petition, and if necessary, to request a conference call with the Board. The parties have met and conferred, and this request is unopposed by Patent Owner.

It is believed that withdrawal of the Petition would promote efficiency by saving Board resources by not having the consider the briefing on discretionary denial, or issue a decision on discretionary denial. The Patent Owner has already briefed the Board on its positions in favor of discretionary denial (Request for Discretionary Denial dated September 17, 2025, Paper No. 6). It is believed that withdrawal would achieve the same effect as advocated by Patent Owner more efficiently, without using the Board's resources. Further, additional briefing and consideration (e.g., Patent Owner's Preliminary Response and Petitioner's reply) would not be required, thus saving additional the Board as well as the parties further resources. Petitioner is not aware of any other active proceedings before the Board on the subject patent, and does not intend to challenge the subject patent in the future.

The timing of the request for withdrawal would be prior to the Board having the full briefing of both parties on issues of discretionary denial and any briefing on the Patent Owner's Preliminary Response and Petitioner's reply, as distinguished from other proceedings in which pre-institution withdrawal has been denied (e.g., *Ocado Group PLC v. Autostore Tech. AS*, PGR2021-00038, where decision was imminent by the Board, and full briefing had been submitted by the parties). Thus, significant resources would be saved by withdrawal of this Petition.
