**PLAINTIFF’S DISCLOSURE OF ASSERTED CLAIMS AND PRELIMINARY
INFRINGEMENT CONTENTIONS PURSUANT TO P.R. 3-1 & P.R. 3-2 AND
DOCUMENT PRODUCTION ACCOMPANYING DISCLOSURE**

Pursuant to Patent Rules 3-1 and 3-2, Plaintiff Telcom Ventures LLC (“Telcom”) hereby provides its Disclosure of Asserted Claims and Preliminary Infringement Contentions and Document Production Accompanying Disclosure concerning Defendants Samsung Electronics Co., Ltd. and Samsung Electronics America, Inc. (collectively, “Samsung” or “Defendants”). Telcom reserves the right to amend or modify its disclosures herein—including to supplement its infringement contentions pursuant to P.R. 3-6—based on additional information obtained through discovery (which has not yet begun) or other means concerning the Defendants’ products and activities.

I. Telcom’s P.R. 3-1 Disclosures

A. P.R. 3-1(a): Infringed Claims

Subject to ongoing investigation and upcoming discovery (which has not yet begun), and based on available information obtained to date, Telcom contends that Samsung infringes the

claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 9,462,411 (“the ’411 Patent”), 9,832,708 (“the ’708 Patent”), 10,219,199 (“the ’199 Patent”), 10,674,432 (“the ’432 Patent”), 11,770,756 (“the ’756 Patent”), 11,924,743 (“the ’743 Patent”), 11,937,172 (“the ’172 Patent”), and 12,028,793 (“the ’793 Patent”) (collectively, the “Asserted Patents”) set forth in the table below.

Telcom contends that Samsung directly infringes the identified patents and claims of the Patents-in-Suit under 35 U.S.C. § 271(a) by making, using, offering to sell, and/or selling in the United States and/or importing into the United States, the Accused Products set forth in Part I.B below, and by practicing the asserted method claims of the Patents-in-Suit in the United States.

Telcom further contends that Samsung indirectly infringes the identified patents and claims of the Patents-in-Suit under 35 U.S.C. § 271(b) by actively and knowingly inducing, directing, causing, and encouraging others, including, but not limited to, their designers, manufacturers, suppliers, distributors, resellers, software developers, customers, end users, subscribers, and repair providers, to directly infringe the Patents-in-Suit by making, using, offering to sell, and/or selling in the United States and/or importing into the United States, the Accused Products set forth in Part I.B below. Telcom contends that Samsung actively and knowingly induces infringement by others by, *inter alia*, providing the aforementioned direct infringers with (i) infringing functionality and/or devices; (ii) manuals, guides, technical documentation, technical support and assistance, advertisements, and marketing; and/or (iii) software and/or firmware updates. For example, Samsung teaches its customers how to use the Accused Products to carry out financial transactions using Samsung Pay and/or Google Pay. See, for example:

Telcom further contends that Samsung indirectly infringes the identified patents and claims of the Patents-in-Suit under 35 U.S.C. § 271(c) because the Accused Products include at least one component that constitutes a material part of the invention, knowing the same to be especially made or especially adapted for use in an infringement of the patent, and not a staple article or commodity of commerce suitable for substantial noninfringing use.

Telcom reserves the right to supplement its position as to infringement following discovery and/or claim construction.

Telcom reserves the right to supplement its infringement contentions to identify additional products and/or activities, if necessary, when it is provided with non-public documents and/or source code from Samsung and/or third parties via the discovery process.

C. P.R. 3-1(c): Preliminary Infringement Charts

Subject to ongoing investigation and upcoming discovery (which has not yet begun), and based on available information obtained to date, Telcom contends that each element of each apparatus claim is found within each Accused Product, and that each element of each method step is practiced, as shown in the preliminary infringement charts attached hereto as Exhibits A through H. Telcom reserves the right to amend its asserted claims and infringement contentions pursuant to P.R. 3-6 as discovery begins and progresses and as additional information is gathered.

D. P.R. 3-1(d): Literal Infringement and Infringement Under the Doctrine of Equivalents

Subject to ongoing investigation and upcoming discovery (which has not yet begun), and based on available information obtained to date, Telcom contends that each element of each asserted claim is literally present in each of the Accused Products as shown in the preliminary infringement charts attached hereto as Exhibits A, B, C, D, E, F, G, & H. As indicated above, discovery is necessary to further develop Telcom's infringement positions, including literal infringement and infringement under the doctrine of equivalents. The Court has yet to issue a claim construction order. At this juncture, Telcom contends that Samsung literally infringes each element of each asserted claims. To the extent any element is not literally infringed, Telcom contends that

the element is satisfied under the doctrine of equivalents because the Accused Products perform substantially the same function in substantially the same way to obtain the same result, and because any differences between the claimed invention and the Accused Products are insubstantial. Pursuant to P.R. 3-6, Telcom expressly reserves the right to amend and supplement its position on whether there is literal infringement and/or infringement under the doctrine of equivalents of any element of any Asserted Claim after discovery begins and progresses and upon receipt of this Court's claim construction order.

E. P.R. 3-1(e): Priority Dates

The Asserted Claims of the '411 Patent are entitled to a priority date of November 4, 2008.

The Asserted Claims of the '708 Patent are entitled to a priority date of November 4, 2008.

The Asserted Claims of the '199 Patent are entitled to a priority date of November 4, 2008.

The Asserted Claims of the '432 Patent are entitled to a priority date of November 4, 2008.

The Asserted Claims of the '756 Patent are entitled to a priority date of November 4, 2008.

The Asserted Claims of the '743 Patent are entitled to a priority date of November 4, 2008.

The Asserted Claims of the '172 Patent are entitled to a priority date of November 4, 2008.

The Asserted Claims of the '793 Patent are entitled to a priority date of November 4, 2008.

F. P.R. 3-1(f): Right to Reply on Plaintiff's Own Instrumentality

Telcom does not contend that it practices the Asserted Claims of the Asserted Patents.
