3. **Claims 1-6** are provisionally rejected on the ground of nonstatutory double patenting as being unpatentable over **claims 14 and 25-26** of copending Application No. 16/942,335. Although the claims at issue are not identical, they are not patentably distinct from each other because both applicant discloses a shoe having an upper, a sole, an elastic element at the side portion, a stabilizer comprising a base and an elevated portion, wherein the stabilizer having a curvature, flare portion and rigid material, the stabilizer further have a window.

This is a provisional nonstatutory double patenting rejection because the patentably indistinct claims have not in fact been patented.
